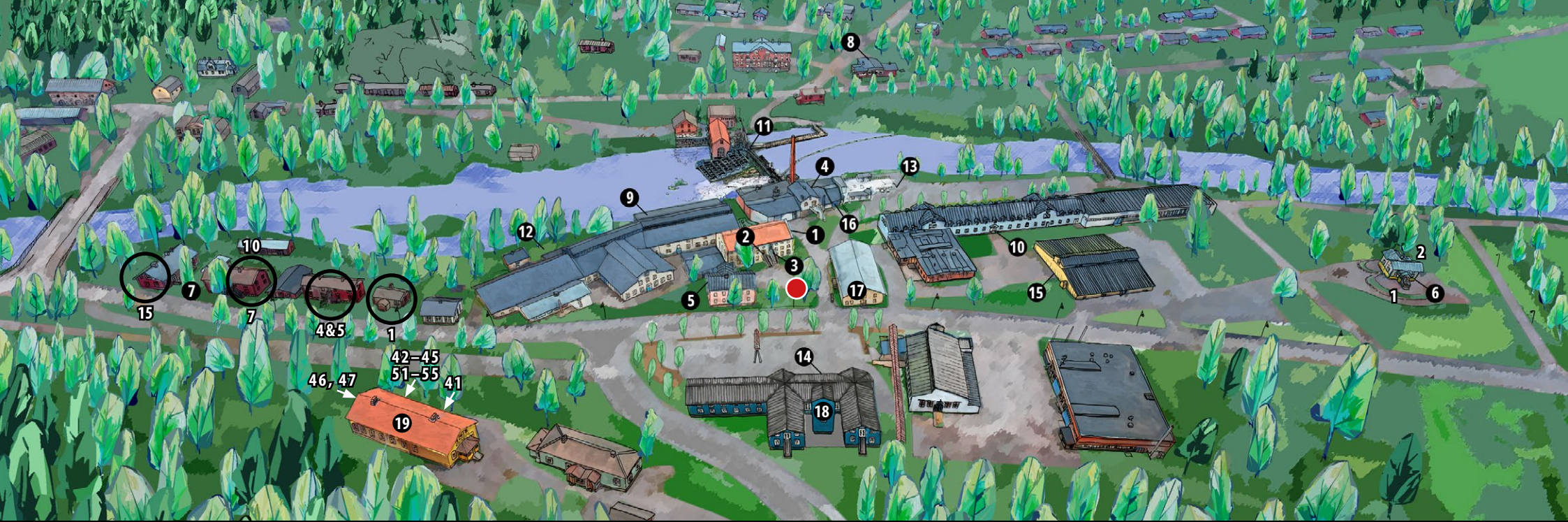

### Brief history 1641—now

Billnäs Ironworks was founded by Carl Billsten in 1641, becoming Finland's first privately owned ironworks. The initial products manufactured here were tools and nails made from iron ore. The golden era of the ironworks spanned from 1890 until Finland's independence. One of its most famous products is the Billnäs axe.

From 1920 to 1980, Billnäs Ironworks was part of the Fiskars company's operations. In 2008, Olli Muurainen acquired ownership of Billnäs Ironworks and began restoration work soon after. Today, many of the buildings have been renovated and are used for hotels, restaurants, and events.

#### Herraskartano

Rooms 46, 47: Entrance from  
the backside of the building

Room 41: Entrance from the  
middle of the building, first  
door

Rooms 42–45: Entrance from  
the middle of the building,  
second door

Rooms 51–55: Entrance from  
the middle of the building,  
second door, up the stairs

#### Leopold 15

First door closest to the road,  
up the stairs on the right and  
first door to the left.

#### Fridolf

7: Entrance on the building's  
roadside, through the  
middle door.

10: Entrance at the back of  
the building, up the wooden  
stairs and through the door  
on the left.

#### Johan 4 & 5

Entrance on the building's  
roadside, up the wooden  
stairs.

#### Carl 1

Entrance on the right-hand  
side of the building.

#### Karlsborg

1. Bottom floor, entrance on  
the building's roadside.
2. Upper floor, entrance at  
the back of the building.

#### Torni

Dark blue building across  
the road, second door from  
the left. Go straight ahead  
and take the stairs to the  
top floor.
